You are encouraged to submit your paper or article directly to the appropriate series editor. All papers and articles submitted to NALDIC will be subject to review. Articles for *NALDIC Quarterly* will be reviewed by the editor and authors may be invited to undertake minor amendments.

In the case of *EAL Matters* the review process comprises of an initial internal review by the series editor. At this point you may be asked to consider resubmitting your article or paper to another series editor. Authors whose paper receives a favourable internal review are given an opportunity to revise before external review. In external review, you will receive an additional set of comments which will assist you in the preparation of your work for publication.

This process, which can take up to six months, helps to ensure both quality across NALDIC's publications and timeliness in the review process.
